Irresponsible spending and tax hikes are endangering our economic well being.


IRRESPONSIBLE SPENDING

- I consistently vote to hold the line on spending and oppose fiscally irresponsible legislation that forces working Americans to spend their hard earned money to fund government programs.
- This session, the House of Representatives, under the direction of a Democrat Majority, passed spending bills—to the tune of \$22 billion more than the Administration's proposed budget. I voted against these spending measures.

INCREASED TAXES

- From 2001–2010, Republican-passed tax relief will result in nearly \$11,000 in savings per Oklahoma family.
- Unless Congress acts, Republican-passed tax relief is set to expire in 2010 and will result in 115 million Americans paying higher taxes.
- Expiration of the tax relief means a \$2,848 tax increase for each worker in Oklahoma's First Congressional District and a loss of thousands of dollars in savings.
